

# Downtown Trick-or-Treating

Below are best practice recommendations from the Pettis County Health Department to ensure Trick-or-Treating remains fun and safe in 2020.

## For Merchants

- ✓ Give treats outdoors, if possible.
- ✓ Wash hands before handling treats.
- ✓ Wear a cloth mask as part of your costume; a costume mask is not a substitute for a cloth mask.
- ✓ Avoid direct contact with Trick-or-Treaters.
- ✓ Keep hand sanitizer handy and use it after touching objects or other people.

## Tip

Set up a station with individually bagged treats for kids to take.

## For Parents

- ✓ Trick-or-Treaters should wear a cloth mask; DO NOT wear a costume mask over a cloth mask for it may make breathing difficult.
- ✓ Cloth masks should NOT be worn by children under the age of 2 or by anyone with trouble breathing.
- ✓ Keep hand sanitizer handy for you and your children and use it after touching objects or other people.
- ✓ Ensure you and your children stay 6 feet apart from other people.
- ✓ Wash hands with soap and water when you get home before you or your children eat any treats.
