

Governor Parson stops in Sedalia to celebrate local employer's growth

Sedalia printing company to create 20 jobs and invest \$1.85 million in new facility

JEFFERSON CITY, MO – Governor Mike Parson stopped in Sedalia on Tuesday to promote job growth and announce the expansion of yearbook manufacturer Jostens.

Having outgrown their primary facility and secondary coil and fulfillment center, the company will be consolidating to a larger facility and expanding their production lines.

With this expansion, Jostens will move all of its small yearbook production to the Sedalia facility, doubling the output of the Sedalia plant.
