Did you know, historians have traced the creation of glass as far back as 3500 BC in Mesopotamia? Through the years, man has purposed different types of glass for a range of uses from the practical houseware and automobile glass to the creation of beautiful works of art such as the installments like the Chihuly exhibit at the Daum Museum of Contemporary Art located on the Sedalia campus of State Fair Community College.

Just as years of hard work and fine-tuning perfected the composition of glass, because of the volume of glass now used in our everyday life, we need to consider the best way to repurpose this invention to keep it out of the landfill. This is the reason the City of Sedalia is partnering with Ripple Glass of Kansas City to reuse consumer glass.

In 2009, Kansas Citians realized they were annually throwing away 150 million pounds of glass. The problem -- no facility in the area processed glass for reuse. The community and companies, including Boulevard Brewing Company, who noted over 10 million of their own empty bottles in the above total pounds of glass, helped found Ripple Glass.

The Ripple Glass facility cleans and crushes the glass into glass cullet as pictured in the bottle on the top right of this page. This cullet may then be used by customers, for example, Owens Corning, to

make fiberglass insulation. The cullet is also used by a company named Ardagh, who turns the product into glass bottles. One of Ardagh's customers is Boulevard Brewing Company!

When glass is mixed with other materials, Ripple Glass has found nearly half of the collected glass becomes unsalvageable and ends up in the landfill. That is why glass is not collected as part of the City's curbside recycling as it breaks easily and can injure workers at the material recovery facility.

The City of Sedalia offers glass recycling bins at a central location at 1002 S. Massachusetts Avenue, just south of Smith-Cotton Jr. High School and at our Materials Management Site located at 27882 Highway U, Sedalia, Missouri. New purple containers purchased with grant funds from the West Central Mo Solid Waste Management District and the Missouri Department of Natural Resource will soon allow for two new locations.
