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2018 – it has been **the year** for Sedalia Area Neighborhood Watch Groups to take the lead in promoting a lot of clean up and even more pride in property ownership by hosting neighborhood cleanups. The City has assisted these neighborhood watch groups by providing guidance and event promotion.



The first cleanup was hosted by the Victorian Towers Neighborhood Watch on June 2, 2018 and their group successfully cleaned up an area between Broadway to 3rd Street and between Grand to Vermont.

The second neighborhood cleanup was held on July 28, 2018 and hosted by the Queen City Neighborhood Watch. This group also made a tremendous impact on an area between Park Avenue to Grand, from 3rd Street to 6th Street.

Recycling and garbage carts will begin being delivered on Sept. 17, 2018, weather permitting. All 14,400+ carts are planned for delivery to homes by Sept. 28, 2018. Each household will be provided one 95 or 65 gallon gray cart for garbage and one 95 or 65 gallon blue cart for recyclables. To keep garbage and recycling fees as **low as possible**, we encourage everyone to recycle.

Use of carts delayed until Nov. 6. On Sept. 7, the automated truck manufacturer notified the City of a delay in delivering the new trucks. With the late change from McNeilus on the trucks, the cart manufacturer was unable to reschedule distribution of carts to homes. Carts will be delivered between Sept. 17 and Sept. 28, but their use will be delayed **until Nov. 6**. While this delay is beyond our control, we apologize for the confusion.

The Recycling Partnership provided the City a grant for recycling carts requiring each home have a cart delivered for their use. If you choose not to recycle, please call (660) 827-7820 to let us know your recycling cart may be picked up. Those “extra” recycling carts will be made available to families needing an extra cart due to the volume of recyclables generated by their family.

An informational packet will be attached to the gray garbage cart when it is delivered. This informational packet will contain a copy of the modified schedule for holiday collection for the balance of 2018 and all of 2019. Also, included in the packet will be a listing of acceptable recyclable materials, a collection day route map for each neighborhood, a listing of frequently asked questions and contact information should you have any other questions about garbage and recycling collection or pick-up on demand services.

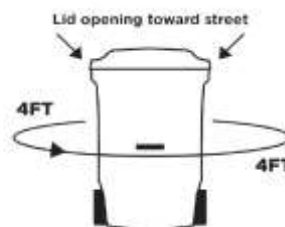
Collection days and routes have not changed. Carts are to be placed at the curb or street with the lid opening toward the street on your collection day by 6:00 a.m. As shown in the diagram above on the right, space should be left between carts and other objects to allow for the garbage truck to easily pick-

IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE FOR NEW CARTS

- Sept. 7 – Manufacturer notifies City of **additional delay** in truck delivery. **New Date: Nov. 1.**
- Sept. 17-Sept. 28 -- Cart delivery scheduled for 14,400+ carts.
- Sept. 17 – Nov. 1 -- Residents **do not** use carts. Continue use of garbage cans, bags, etc.
- Nov. 6 (Tues.)– Use of new carts begins.**

Place cart in proper direction and leave four foot spacing between other objects.

Some streets in Sedalia will not allow for collection to occur at the curb or street. Homes in these neighborhoods will have a door hanger placed at the residence notifying them that their garbage and recycling collection point **will not** change as a result of the change-over to the cart system. A rear-loading garbage/recycling truck equipped with tippers for emptying carts will be used in those areas where space is limited.

Carts are branded with serial numbers and UPC codes to make them easily identifiable. Additionally, carts have embedded RFID tags that allow them to be located or tracked, if moved, from their delivery location.

Progress on the Sedalia Police Headquarters



Construction continues to move steadily on the new Sedalia Police Headquarters. All stair pans have been filled with concrete and much of the building's gypsum and tile backer board is in place. Most notable for the passer-by is the brickwork and installation of the west canopy on the outside of the building. Window measurements have been taken in anticipation of installing the glass once brickwork has been completed. Building completion date is still estimated for mid-November.
